Ground rules were reviewed and Ann Bass will be the reporter for the board meeting February 15, 2012

Preschool Tuition Policy (action requested)

Val Cameron, preschool enrichment coordinator provided the committee with pros and cons of the current preschool tuition policy and process as well as information as to how other ECI areas are administering preschool tuition assistance. Val commended the 4 R Kids board for having a detailed preschool policy.

Successes – universal application; quality measures; income verification (tax return much easier than the paystubs); policies; service (openness to accommodate families in Polk and Marion County; availability of preschool funds; supportive services. Challenges – hours of instruction; priority by age processed within 72 hours; charge over \$150 for tuition then maximum reimbursed at \$150 (no sliding fee); government funded programs; programs closing- two faith based programs in Winterset and West Des Moines, 2 preschool programs have decreased enrollment of 30 children, reduction of staff; preschool tuition numbers are down from previous years; parents choice – faith based full versus half, transportation school setting.

It was consensus of the committee to recommend modifications to the preschool policy for FY2013; a new policy is included with these minutes. Modifications to the current policy are as follows:

Application section- Remove "has the child attended a voluntary preschool in the past" Add the "county the child resides" in and add "email address"; Quality section - Remove ECERS and add "QRS (3-5)"

Priority by age's section - Add "In order to obligate adequate funds for 4 year olds, an initial maximum amount of funds (determined by the 4 R Kids ECI Area Board) will be set aside for 3 year olds until September 1. After September 1 all applications will be open to preschool age children."

Income verification- Delete" other government agency verification (WIC, food assistance, hawk-I, title 19)" Add "FIP and/or unemployment benefits; additional income verification considerations may be considered for extenuating circumstances Sliding fee section – Update example using current federal poverty guidelines "(example – a family of 4 making up to \$28,813 annually will receive 90% tuition assistance)" Caps section – Remove "preschools that offer 4 year old programming shall have a cap for tuition assistance of \$150 per month, preschools that offer 3 year old programming may charge up to \$3.75 per hour up to a cap of \$150 per month" Change to "preschools

that offer 4 year old programming shall have a cap of \$150 per month maximum even if tuition is over the \$150 maximum amount

Use of other government funded programs – Remove "priority to fill state and federal funded slots first (i.e Head Start, Shared Visions, Statewide Voluntary Preschool program) as defined in state tool CC(A) only considering other options when compelling circumstances warrant"

Change to "Pending family eligibility Head Start and Shard Visions slots shall be filled first as defined in state tool CC; Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program slots will be encouraged to be filled before providing preschool tuition assistance"

Contractor Mileage for Board Meetings (action requested)

Mileage reimbursement for contractors to attend board meetings was discussed. It is consensus of the committee for the following recommendations. A policy is included with these minutes.

"Mileage to attend board meetings may be reimbursed when the agency has been requested to attend board meetings and if they are part of the board agenda. Mileage reimbursement rates are allowed to be set by the agency and shall not exceed the federal mileage reimbursement rate. Future contracts shall include this language."

Family Directions Contract (*information*)

Deb provided an update regarding the transition of the PAT program. All contractual obligations have been met and the last payment vouchers have been received and have passed the technical review.

Semi Annual Reports (information)

The committee reviewed the semiannual progress reports and a summary of the reports are included with these minutes. It was noted it would be helpful to add the number of FTEs to the digital dashboard in the future. The majority of the programs were meeting benchmarks, however two programs will be contacted and requested to provide a plan on how they plan to meet their benchmarks.

FY2013 Request for Proposal (*information*)

The draft timeline for the RFP was reviewed; release RFP March 13, 2012 with RFP's due April 23, 2012. Deb will work on the FY2013 RFP and sent it to the committee for review before the March board meeting.
