Services are available to families in Adair, Dallas, Madison, and Warren County**

Preschool Tuition Assistance (Serving Adair, Dallas, Madison, and Warren County)

This program provides preschool tuition scholarships for children whose families meet income guidelines of up to 200% of the federal poverty level to give children the opportunity to attend preschool. Preschool Enrichment Services (Serving Adair, Dallas, Madison, and Warren County)

This service coordinates all preschool supportive services so children are more prepared for kindergarten. Services are as follows:

- preschool tuition scholarships for preschool aged children
- dental screenings for preschool aged children
- transportation for preschool aged children
- quality improvement efforts for qualifying preschools
- technical assistance and coordination for preschools and subcontractors of service
