The agency checks all program data bases for consistency on a regular basis and as of this report, they are all congruent with the exception of the DAISEY child count which may be higher than what other systems report. The PAT Program Supervisor provides a monthly report as to the status of the Program waiting list. Stories for the quarter: "This first quarter I have 8 families with either some child on meds for emotional/behavior issues or Mom/parents very concerned about serious out-bursts/behaviors they are seeking help to solve. I have two using PCIT and one seeking PCIT services. I have five Moms on meds. Lots of questions and discussion. While PAT is not designed to provide mental health services, these families often face a lack of options for care so we regularly help families process their choices and questions about their mental health." (#2) " After only my third visit with the family, Mom said she had read through the material/information that I had left on language development for 3 year olds. She said she is concerned that her daughter is delayed in this area. I was very pleased that the information had enlightened her and also empowered her to ask questions. The next time I go to a visit, I will be bringing more information on AEA services and will see if Mom is interested in proceeding with requesting a screening."

Transitioning to a new educator took less time then anticipated but with starting to do visits the second week of August it shows in our benchmarks. The educator has been recruiting families at community events and WIC clinics. WE have enrolled 7 new families since starting visits.

Successes- In the past 2 months I have had 2 families that were able to safety proof their homes with safety kits that they earned with their points. Both families had significant safety concerns that were identified at their home visits. One family was not aware of several of the significant safety risk until we reviewed safety proofing checklist including having significant electrical outlets not covered with child continuing to crawl over to outlets and attempt to touch with parent attempting to redirect the child away from outlets. One family that was at in-laws on consistent basis discussed having basement with no door and had attempted to have makeshift barriers that was not working and was causing significant stress within the family. Educator assisted family in picking out a safety gate designed to attach to doorway. Family sent educator a picture of the gate attached in doorway at in-laws sharing feelings of relief and security for their child now when they go to in-laws. We are at 71% of new families meeting ECI criteria. I am not concerned about this. It is early in the year and I know we will be able to reach 75%. With one more family meeting criteria we will be at 75%. We are aware and watching this closely in our program as we recruit new families.
