□ **Bring Love Ministry** – Provides support for foster and adoptive parents in Madison County. Bring Love has a free clothing (Kloset4KIDS) located at CRISP that can supply foster children ages infant to teen with clothing needs. We provide meals for foster families when they get a foster placement. We also have local photographers that will take pictures of foster children for special occasions or adoption day photos. Bring Love will sponsor various community events to raise awareness and support for foster children.  \Box **Childcare Nurse Consultant** - The purpose of this program is to promote best practice by providing guidance and technical assistance to child care and preschool providers, regarding the health and safety of the children in their care, this is accomplished via onsite visits; group trainings, and telephone and mailing communications.  \Box C.R.I.S.P. (Community Resources in Service to People) - "A place to go when you don't know." Provides some resources directly for urgent situations, matches clients to resources in the community, and runs annually the following direct assistance service projects: Backpacks4KIDS, WinterWear4KIDS, Band & Choir Clothing4KIDS, Christmas4KIDS.  \Box Crisis Intervention & Advocacy Center - Provides support for victims and survivors of sexual abuse and domestic violence. Trained advocates present evidence-based curriculum to children ages 3-18 in an effort to prevent child sexual abuse. Education, counseling, medical and legal advocacy, and support groups are provided to children and parents at no cost. All services are completely voluntary and confidential.  \Box **Dental Screenings** – The I-SmileTM Program provides care coordination and support to families with young children who need dental care.  \Box Immunizations - Immunizations for uninsured and underinsured children up to 18 years of age at no charge. Immunizations for adults are available for a fee.  \Box I-SmileTM Program - The I-SmileTM Program provides care coordination and support to families with young children who need dental care. The I-SmileTM team can help with: setting up appointments; giving reminders of when a dental appointment is; providing preventive services such as dental screenings and fluoride treatments; and teaching children and parents about how to keep a healthy mouth.  \Box Leadie Eddie- Puppet show presentation for preschools providing blood lead poisoning prevention education in an entertaining format. Includes written information to send home to parents.  \Box Maternal Health - Provides services for women living in Warren County, who are pregnant or have recently given birth.
