Together we will encourage policy and practice changes at both county and local levels.	Madison County CARES is comprised of community members and agencies which strive to make each community better for Madison County families. The group discusses needs and concerns within the county and takes action to address the needs and concerns when necessary. The group also collaborates with agencies, schools, etc. in each community to provide an annual Drug Drop, the Every 15 Minutes program, a Health, Wellness and Safety Fair and Family Fun Day all geared towards bettering Madison County.	The CPPC Steering Committee is made up of 12 voting members and a host of community providers. Though all give valuable input, only the voting members act as an advisory board to the DCAT Governance Board. The voting members read all funding proposals and make recommendations to the Board. The group as a whole discusses issues/concerns within the communities as they arise. If it is deemed necessary that action be taken, the voting members make a recommendation to the Board for things such as funding, new programming, etc.
